

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED APRIL 16, 2007

ORD. NO. 190-2007 authorizing the Director of the Department of Planning and Urban Development to enter into a grant agreement with the Kutz Foundation for the disbursement of foundation funds for the improvement of the lives of at-risk children in the City of Akron; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 191-2007 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the labor and materials needed to paint City owned oil and gas well equipment; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 192-2007 authorizing the Director of Health to enter into contracts with Violet's Cupboard, Inc. and the North American Indian Cultural Center for primary care services for persons living with HIV/AIDS in underserved communities; authorizing payment therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 193-2007 accepting conveyance(s) by deed of estates in fee simple of property in the City of Akron, for the ELIZABETH PARK URBAN RENEWAL AREA project; authorizing payment therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 194-2007 accepting conveyance(s) by deed of estates in fee simple of property in the City of Akron, for the LEGGETT COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER project; authorizing payment therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 195-2007 approving the Redevelopment Plan for the South Main – Miller Redevelopment Area; making necessary findings in connection therewith; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 196-2007 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into an agreement for the purchase of credits for the mitigation of wetland areas as needed for construction of the White Pond Office Park and other projects; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 197-2007 amending The Zoning Map by changing the Single-Family Residence Use District (U1,H1,A1) Classification for four lots on the south side of West Long Street to a Retail Business Use District (U3,H1,A3) Classification; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 198-2007 rejecting the recommendations of the Fact Finder in the matter of city of Akron and Fraternal Order of Police, Akron Lodge No. 7, Case No. 06-MED-10-1217; and declaring an emergency.

RES. NO. 199-2007 Resolution declaring the necessity and intent of the City of Akron to appropriate a fee simple interest, temporary right-of-way easement, utility easement and work agreement easement interests in certain real property owned by

S.E.T. Enterprises, LLC, An Ohio Limited Liability Company located at 595 E. Tallmadge Avenue, for the purposes of making or repairing roads that are open to the public in conjunction with the SUM 261-11.57 Project; declaring the necessity and intention of the City of Akron to proceed under Ohio Revised Code, Section 163.06(B) for the purpose of making or repairing roads that are open to the public without charge; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 200-2007 Ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the construction of ADA compliant curb ramps; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 201-2007 ratifying the actions of the Director of Public Service in contracting with Kenmore Construction Co., Inc. for emergency repairs to the outfall pipe from CSO Rack 13; authorizing payment therefore; and declaring an emergency.

RES. NO. 202-2007 opposing and objecting to the application of Georgies Girls, LLC d.b.a. Georgies Girls, 1306 Brittain Road, Akron, Ohio for Class D1, D3, D3A liquor permits now pending before the Division of Liquor Control; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 203-2007 authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with Oriana House, Inc. for confinement, rehabilitation services and alternative sentencing options for offenders convicted in Akron Municipal Court of Akron Code violations; authorizing payment therefore; and declaring an emergency.

RES. NO. 204-2007 expressing support and urging Akron citizens to vote for Issue 17, the City of Akron's proposed tax rate increase of one-third of one percent on earned income to provide funds to hire police officers, improve neighborhoods, provide equipment and facilities for public safety forces, keep and create jobs, address flooding problems and operate community learning centers in off-school hours; and declaring an emergency.
