

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED MAY 21, 2012

ORD. NO. 158-2012 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into an agreement with the Ohio Director of Transportation for painting of four structures crossing over I77; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 159-2012 ratifying the actions of the Director of Public Service in entering into a contract with Gironda Construction for the emergency installation of sidewalks and curb ramps to provide a pedestrian crossing on Independence Avenue; authorizing payment therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 160-2012 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the construction of repairs to various sidewalks and removal of trees located throughout the City; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 161-2012 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the upgrade of the distributed control system at the Akron Water Plant; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 162-2012 ratifying the actions of the Director of Public Service in entering into a contract with Kenmore Construction for replacement of a storm sewer located along the west side of Goodwill on Waterloo Road; accepting a sewer easement for property owned by Goodwill Industries; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 163-2012 authorizing the Mayor to enter into contracts for city-sponsored arts programming during the summer of 2012; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 164-2012 authorizing the Director of the Department of Planning and Urban Development to enter into agreements with local agencies to carry out the Emergency Solutions Grant Program for 2012; and declaring an emergency.

RES. NO. 165-2012 approving and confirming the appointments of Roberta E. Aber and Cynthia Flynn Capers, PhD, RN, to the Akron Health Commission; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 166-2012 authorizing the Mayor to execute the Summit County Intergovernmental Memorandum of Understanding for Job Creation and Retention and Tax Revenue Sharing; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 167-2012 authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the purchase of three photocopier units for use by the Akron Municipal Court; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 168-2012 providing for adjustments in employee compensation with the Civil Service Personnel Association, Inc.; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 169-2012 amending and/or supplementing Ordinance No. 16-2009 for those permanent full-time bargaining unit members of the Civil Service Personnel Association, Inc. (C.S.P.A.) bargaining unit; approving changes in benefits; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 170-2012 providing for the issuance and sale of bonds of the City in a maximum principal amount of \$190,000,000 for the purpose of refunding bonds previously issued by the City for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, improving, renovating, repairing, enlarging, adding to, reconstructing, maintaining, equipping, furnishing, acquiring interests in real property in connection with, improving the sites of, and otherwise improving, Community Learning Centers, and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 171-2012 authorizing the Mayor to lease a portion of 1085 Sweitzer Avenue to RES Polyflow LLC; and declaring an emergency.

RES. NO. 172-2012 declaring it necessary to improve various off-street parking facilities in the Kenmore Business District and the Canton Road Business District by sealing, resurfacing and repairing, painting parking space stripes, sweeping, removing snow, cleaning sewer openings, providing lawn, turf, shrub and tree maintenance, litter and other general clean-up and otherwise improving and maintaining the same, and all when and where necessary; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 173-2012 authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with Oriana House, Inc. for confinement, rehabilitation services and alternative sentencing options for offenders convicted of Akron Code violations; and declaring an emergency.
