ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED JULY 7, 2014:

ORD. NO. 203-2014 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for completion of the Wilbeth Wetlands project; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 13-0*

ORD. NO. 204-2014 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the interior and exterior painting of two Low Boy water storage tanks on Longstone Avenue; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 13-0*

ORD. NO. 205-2014 authorizing the Purchasing Agent, without the formality of advertising for bids, to enter into a contract with Document Technology Services for incident report scanning services; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 13-0*

ORD. NO. 206-2014 authorizing the issuance of notes of the City to the Ohio Air Quality Development Authority in the maximum principal amount of \$900,000 under Section 717.02 of the Ohio Revised Code to finance the costs of an “energy conservation measure” as defined in Section 717.02 of the Ohio Revised Code; authorizing and approving related documents and matters; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 13-0*

ORD. NO. 207-2014 approving the donation of City-owned property at 272 Morningview Ave. and 465 Watson St. to Mustard Seed Development Center, and the donation of property at 436 Watson St. and 312 Morningview Ave. to Nazareth Housing Development Corporation; determining said property is not needed for public use; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 13-0*

ORD. NO. 208-2014 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the construction to improve Wilbeth Road from Dallas Avenue to Interstate 77; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0 (Swirsky did not vote)*

RES. NO. 209-2014 declaring it necessary to improve various off-street parking facilities in the Kenmore Business District and the Canton Road Business District by sealing, resurfacing and repairing, painting parking space stripes, sweeping, removing snow, cleaning sewer openings, providing lawn, turf, shrub and tree maintenance, litter and other general clean-up and otherwise improving and maintaining the same, and all when and where necessary; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0 (Swirsky did not vote)*
