ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED NOVEMBER 3, 2014:

ORD. NO. 336-2014 declaring improvements to certain real property located in the Eastgate II Urban Redevelopment Area to be a public purpose and exempt from real property taxation; declaring that construction and rehabilitation of certain real property is a public purpose; providing for the collection of service payments in lieu of taxes and the deposit of those service payments in the Urban Redevelopment Tax Increment Equivalent Fund; providing for the payment of a portion of said service payments to the Akron Public School District; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 13-0***

ORD. NO. 337-2014 ratifying the actions of the Director of Public Service in entering into a contract with A. Crano Excavating Inc. for emergency repair of the lateral sanitary sewer at 533 West Market Street; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 13-0***

ORD. NO. 338-2014 authorizing the Mayor to file an application and enter into an agreement with the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the Ohio Water Development Authority for loans from the Water Supply Revolving Loan Fund to fund the design and/or construction of facilities for the Water Supply Bureau; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 13-0***

ORD. NO. 339-2014 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the purchase and installation of modular carpet tiles at the Water Reclamation Facility's administration building; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 13-0***

ORD. NO. 340-2014 authorizing the Purchasing Agent, without the formality of advertising for bids, to enter into a contract with I2C Technologies, Ltd. For the purchase and installation of video surveillance equipment and software for the Water Distribution Division building; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 13-0***

ORD. NO. 341-2014 authorizing a Conditional Use to install an electronic message center sign at 820 Canton Road; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 13-0***
