



CITY OF AKRON, OHIO

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED JUNE 8, 2015:

ORD. NO. 156-2015 authorizing the Purchasing Agent to enter into a contract, without the formality of advertising for bids, with MapSys Systems & Solutions for a computer software upgrade for the Clerk of the Akron Municipal Court; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 157-2015 authorizing the purchase of property on Englewood Avenue for the SUM – Seiberling Way Phase 1 Project; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 158-2015 approving the sale of the western half of vacant land on Eugene St. to Randy W. Moore; the eastern half of vacant land on Eugene St. to Optimal Home Solutions LLC; and property on Gem Ave. to Lorene M. Edmonds; determining said property is not needed for public use; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 159-2015 ratifying the actions of the Director of Public Service in entering into a contract with Canal Construction Company for the emergency repair of the sanitary and lateral sewers at 263 East Mill Street; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 160-2015 authorizing the My Neighborhood Our Akron City Council Grant Agreement Program, through which neighborhood-based organizations in each ward in the City will be eligible for small grants in a total amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per ward; authorizing the Director of the Department of Neighborhood Assistance to enter into grant agreements with neighborhood-based organizations to carry out the purposes of the Program; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

RES. NO. 161-2015 urging the Governor and the General Assembly of Ohio to enact meaningful laws to provide for greater accountability, transparency and oversight to the State's charter school system; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

RES. NO. 162-2015 expressing strong opposition to House Bill 180 and Senate Bill 152, which would prohibit cities from requiring contractors to employ a certain number or percentage of residents of that city on local public improvement projects; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

RES. NO. 163-2015 opposing the use of “Fast Track” trade promotion by the Executive Branch of the United States to negotiate trade policy outside of the public eye, which would benefit big businesses at the expense of America's economy and workers; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*
