ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED JANUARY 11, 2016:

ORD. NO. 1-2016 authorizing a Conditional Use to construct the Anne T. Case Community Learning Center at 1393 Westvale Avenue. *VOTE: 13-0*

ORD. NO. 2-2016 Ordinance authorizing and directing the submission to the electors of the City of Akron of a proposal to amend Sections 59, 104, 105, 106, 108 and 116 of the Charter of the City of Akron, in order to promote and support organizational excellence through organized and effective advances in human resources and employee relations, to be voted upon at the next regular City-wide election on March 15, 2016; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 13-0*

ORD. NO. 3-2016 authorizing the Mayor, in order to further the City's efforts to administer accountability-based sanctions to juvenile offenders, to enter into an agreement for funding from the 2015 Juvenile Accountability Block Grant through the State of Ohio, Department of Youth Services; authorizing the expenditure of local funds; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 13-0*

ORD. NO. 4-2016 authorizing the Purchasing Agent to enter into a contract with Fallsway Equipment Company, without the formality of advertising for bids, for the repair of Ladder 9, an Akron Fire Division emergency response vehicle; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 13-0*

ORD. NO. 5-2016 Ordinance authorizing the Mayor, in furtherance of the City's effort to combat violent crimes against women and to provide services to victims of violent crimes, to apply for and enter into an agreement with the State of Ohio, Office of Criminal Justice Services, for grant funds through the Violence Against Women Act program; authorizing the Director of Law to enter into an agreement to implement the grant; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 13-0*

RES. NO. 6-2016 expressing support for President Obama's Executive Action to reduce gun violence and make our communities safer, by improving background checks and reporting, closing the "gun show loophole," increasing funding for enforcement and mental health treatment, and utilizing the latest in gun safety technology; urging Congress to take meaningful, common sense action to support the Administration's action and to fund these measures appropriately; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0 (Freeman left the Chambers before this Resolution was introduced)*
