ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED APRIL 4, 2016:

ORD. NO. 90-2016 accepting residential property on Marvin Avenue by donation for the C.D. Land Banking Project, in order to provide for the future maintenance, redevelopment and productive reuse of the property for the benefit of Akron residents, in furtherance of Mayor Horrigan's objectives of revitalizing neighborhoods, stabilizing property values and reducing blight in our community; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 12-0***

ORD. NO. 91-2016 approving the sale of vacant City-owned land on Wyley Avenue to Renard A. Harmon, pursuant to the City's "A Lot for A Little" Program, in order to facilitate the productive re-use of the property and in furtherance of Mayor Horrigan's objectives of activating underutilized spaces for the benefit of the community, and reducing the cost to the City and the taxpayers in maintaining vacant lots; determining said property is not needed for public use; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 12-0***

ORD. NO. 92-2016 authorizing the Director of the Department of Planning and Urban Development to enter into contracts with non-profit neighborhood based organizations for the provision of services, including, among other things neighborhood events, community gardens, and beautification projects, after school programs and mentoring programs, in order to carry out the intent and purpose of the Neighborhood Partnership Program; authorizing payment therefore; all in furtherance with Mayor Horrigan's objective of encouraging the creation and development of new neighborhood based efforts to strengthen and improve our neighborhoods through safety, education, clean up or vacant lot improvement projects; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 12-0***

ORD. NO. 93-2016 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the construction of the Citywide Sidewalks 2016 Project, in order to repair damaged sidewalks and drive aprons as petitioned by individual property owners throughout the City, in furtherance of Mayor Horrigan's objective of improving the safety, accessibility, and walkability of neighborhoods and business districts in the City in order to facilitate economic development and enhance property values; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 12-0***

ORD. NO. 94-2016 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into an agreement with the Ohio Director of Transportation for the construction of improvements to the Interstate 76/Interstate 77 Main/Broadway Interchange; requesting the Director of Transportation to proceed with the project; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 12-0***

ORD. NO. 95-2016 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into an agreement with the Ohio Director of Transportation for the construction of improvements to State Route 8, in order to lengthen the northbound and southbound off ramps from State Route 8 to Howe Road in order to eliminate backups from the ramp intersections, improve traffic safety and reduce congestions; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 12-0***

ORD. NO. 96-2016 authorizing the Purchasing Agent to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for materials, services and supplies for the removal and installation of windows at the Water Supply Plant, in order to improve energy efficiency and extend the useful life of the facility, by replacing inefficient, single-pane windows that are original to the building and over sixty years old; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

RES. NO. 97-2016 urging all persons between the ages of 50 and 75 to get regular screening for colorectal cancer, in support of the “80% by 2018” campaign of the National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable of the American Cancer Society and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to increase the percentage of adults aged 50 and older who are regularly screened for colon cancer from 65% to 80% by the year 2018; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE 12-0*

ORD. NO. 98-2016 amending/supplementing Title 15, Chapter 153, “Zoning Code,” Sections 153.140 and 153.310 to define and allow for alternative permeable paving surfaces and update the title of referenced engineering drawings, in furtherance of Mayor Horrigan’s objectives of increasing the use of green paving alternatives and reducing the cost to the City and the taxpayers of treating storm water run-off; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 99-2016 authorizing a Conditional Use to establish a vehicle impound lot at 645 Carroll Street; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

RES. NO. 100-2016 adopting an annual operating budget for the fiscal year 2016; and declaring an emergency *VOTE: 12-0*
