

CITY OF AKRON, OHIO

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED APRIL 10, 2017:

ORD. NO. 98-2017 authorizing the Director of Finance to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the purchase of various policies of airport liability insurance; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 99-2017 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into contracts, after publicly advertising for bids, for the purchase of Drawing Reproduction Services needed by the various divisions and departments of the City for a period of time not to exceed 3 years; approving the specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 100-2017 authorizing the Purchasing Agent, without the formality of advertising for bids, to enter into a contract with Otis Elevator Company for the emergency repair of Elevator #2 in the Broadway Parking Deck per specifications; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 101-2017 authorizing the Mayor to accept grant funding from the GPD Group Employees' Foundation; authorizing the expenditure of the grant funds; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 102-2017 authorizing a Conditional Use to retain an attached carport at 1250 Collinwood Avenue; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 9-3 (Fusco, Kammer, Keith)*

ORD. NO. 103-2017 supplementing and amending Title 7, Chapter 73, Article 1, Section 73.01 "Operation while under the influence of alcohol or drug of abuse or with specified concentration of alcohol or drug in certain bodily substances-Chemical test- Penalties"; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*

ORD. NO. 104-2017 creating the City of Akron Volunteer Peace Officers' Dependents Fund Board, electing two members to serve on the Board in accordance with the provisions of Ohio Revised Code Sections 143.01 through 143.11 (the "Act"); and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 11-0 (Kammer abstained)*

RES. NO. 105-2017 supporting Ohio House Bill 123 (HB 123) which would modify Ohio law and, among other things, cap the annual interest rate chargeable by certain "payday" lenders; and declaring an emergency. *VOTE: 12-0*
