WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 153.460-.492 of the Code of Ordinances, the Akron City Planning Commission, at its meeting on May 4, 2017, under file PC-2017-23-CU has reviewed the Conditional Use described in Section 1 hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Staff has found the requested Conditional Use to be consistent with the standards established in Section 153.474 and The Land Use and Development Guide Plan; and

WHEREAS, Council, after public notice and hearing, is of the opinion that the Conditional Use described in Section 1 hereof is in the public interest and serves the public good.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Council of the City of Akron:

Section 1. That David McNeil, whose address is 1885 6th Street S.W., Akron, OH 44314, owner of the following property described in EXHIBIT A, attached, be and is hereby authorized under the provisions of Section 153.460-.492 of the Code of Ordinances of Akron, Ohio, to develop and to use said property for a detached garage as shown on final detailed plans to be filed in the office of the City Planning Commission and subject to the following condition:

- (1) That the Petitioner shall obtain all necessary building permits and inspections.

Section 2. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety for the reason that City Council believes that the topography of the lot makes this the only suitable location for the detached garage, and if this ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. _____-2017, authorizing the Mayor, in furtherance of the City's efforts to combat violent crimes against women and to provide services to victims of violent crimes, to apply for and enter into an agreement with the State of Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services, for 2017 grant funds through the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Subgrant program; to accept and enter into an agreement for 2016 funds previously awarded; and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, under the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994, Pub. L. No. 103-322, money is available to State of Ohio prosecuting agencies subject to a local match contribution in cash or in-kind; and

WHEREAS, the VAWA Subgrant Program assists states and units of local government in developing and strengthening effective law enforcement and prosecution strategies to combat violent crimes against women and in developing and strengthening victim services in cases involving violent crimes against women.
