

AKRON CITY COUNCIL
New Legislation List-September 25, 2017

BUDGET & FINANCE:

1. ORDINANCE accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the Budget Commission of Summit County and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the Summit County Fiscal Officer; and declared an emergency.
2. RESOLUTION requesting that the Summit County Fiscal Officer make an advanced payment of tax funds for tax year 2017 payable in 2018 to the City of Akron Treasury Division; and declaring an emergency.
3. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of notes in a maximum principal amount of \$20,000,000, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to retire notes issued for the purpose of providing funds to pay the costs of various improvements in the City; and declaring an emergency.
4. ORDINANCE providing for the issuance and sale of notes in a principal amount not exceeding \$13,500,000 to pay the property owners' portion, in anticipation of the levy and collection of special assessments, of the cost of improving certain streets in the City, between certain termini, by providing street-cleaning services and street lighting; and declaring an emergency.
5. ORDINANCE providing for the issuance and sale of not to exceed \$500,000 of bonds, to pay, in anticipation of the collection of special assessments heretofore levied, the property owners' portion of the cost of improving certain streets in the City; and declaring an emergency.
6. ORDINANCE providing for the issuance and sale of not to exceed \$3,300,000 of bonds, to pay, in anticipation of the collection of special assessments heretofore levied, the property owners' portion of the cost of improving East Market Street in the City by paving, grading, constructing, reconstructing and installing curbs, concrete sidewalks and driveway approaches, all together with the necessary appurtenances thereto; and declaring an emergency.
7. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$4,485,000, for the purpose of refunding certain maturities of general obligation bonds of the City issued in 2010; and declaring an emergency.
8. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$15,160,000, for the purpose of refunding certain maturities of general obligation bonds of the City issued in 2010; and declaring an emergency.
9. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of notes in a maximum principal amount of \$4,000,000, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to retire notes issued for the purpose of providing funds to pay expenses associated with the settlement of health care claims, whether by reserve or otherwise, and the City's portion of the costs of maintaining its self-insurance program for employee health care benefits; and declaring an emergency.

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10. ORDINANCE providing for the issuance and sale of bonds of the City in a maximum principal amount of \$191,195,000 for the purpose of refunding bonds issued by the City in 2010 to pay the costs of acquiring, constructing, improving, renovating, repairing, enlarging, adding to, reconstructing, maintaining, equipping, furnishing, acquiring interests in real property in connection with, improving the sites of, and otherwise improving, Community Learning Centers, and declaring an emergency.
11. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$25,765,000, for the purpose of refunding certain maturities of income tax revenue bonds of the City issued in 2012; and declaring an emergency.
12. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of notes in a maximum principal amount of \$500,000, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to pay the costs of improving municipal buildings and facilities in the City by constructing, reconstructing, renovating, repairing roofs, remodeling, relocating, making site and other improvements, planning and designing facilities and acquiring and installing related equipment, all as applicable, designated or to be designated by the Director of Public Services; and declaring an emergency.
13. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of notes in a maximum principal amount of \$2,500,000, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to pay the costs of acquiring and equipping motor vehicles for certain Divisions in the City; and declaring an emergency.
14. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of notes in a maximum principal amount of \$200,000, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to pay the costs of improving the municipal parks and recreational system in the City; and declaring an emergency.
15. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of notes in a maximum principal amount of \$1,100,000, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to pay the costs of certain economic development projects in the City; and declaring an emergency.
16. ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of notes in a maximum principal amount of \$5,700,000, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to pay the costs of constructing, reconstructing, and otherwise improving certain streets in the City; and declaring an emergency.
17. ORDINANCE repealing and replacing Ordinance No. 40-2017, creating, establishing, and recognizing departments, offices, bureaus, divisions and positions in the classified service of the City of Akron; requiring that only budgeted funded positions be filled; and declaring an emergency.

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PLANNING:

18. RESOLUTION approving and confirming the appointment by the Mayor of Melinda Scalfaro as a member of the City Board of Zoning Appeals; and declaring an emergency.

19. RESOLUTION approving and confirming the appointment of Mark Smith, Leianne Heppner, David Hawkins, Jaunae Carter, Mark Sweitzer, Charlie Ryder, and Kelvin Berry to the Urban Design and Historic Preservation Commission; and declaring an emergency.

20. ORDINANCE amending Title 3 “Administration,” Chapter 31 “Departments, Boards, and Commissions,” Section 31.391 “Urban Design and Historic Preservation Commission” of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Akron; and declaring an emergency.

PUBLIC SERVICE:

21. ORDINANCE determining to proceed with and levying special assessments for the improvement of certain streets in the City, between certain termini, by providing street-cleaning services and street lighting; approving the report of the Assessment Equalization Board; and declaring an emergency.

PUBLIC SAFETY:

22. ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor or his designee to apply for and accept if awarded a grant from the Ohio Bureau of Workers’ Compensation for the “Safety Intervention Grant for Firefighters’ Exposure to Environmental Elements” for equipment; authorizing the Fire Chief through the Purchasing Agent to enter into an agreement or agreements to carry out the terms of the grant by purchasing the equipment necessary to carry out the purpose of the grant; authorizing the expenditure of local funds; and declaring an emergency.
