### BUDGET & FINANCE

- 0 RESOLUTION declaring it necessary to levy assessments for public improvements and public services for the Downtown Akron Special Improvement District in accordance with Ordinance No. 2-2019 which approved the Downtown Akron Special Improvement District and the Plan for Services to be provided by the Downtown Akron Special Improvement District, Inc. for years 2020-2024, all when and where necessary; and declaring an emergency.

### PLANNING

- 1 ORDINANCE authorizing a Conditional Use to construct the Kenmore/Garfield Community Learning Center at 435 N. Firestone Boulevard; and declaring an emergency. (Scheduled for Public Hearing May 20, 2019)
- 2 ORDINANCE approving the sale of two vacant City-owned properties on Russell Avenue pursuant to the City’s “A Lot for A Little” program, in order to facilitate the productive re-use of the property and to reduce the cost to the City and the taxpayers in maintaining vacant lots; determining said property is not needed for public use; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 ORDINANCE approving the donation of City-owned land located at 473 Harvey Avenue and a vacant lot on Harvey Avenue to Let’s Grow Akron; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor, or his designee, to apply for, and if awarded, accept and expend funding from the Summit County

Land Bank Community Development Matching Grant Fund in accordance with the grant approved budget; authorizing any necessary local match; and declaring an emergency.

- 5 ORDINANCE accepting a vacation plat for Lock Street, between W. Bowery Street and Water Street; and declaring an emergency.
- 6 ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of the Department of Planning and Urban Development to enter into contracts with consultants, for transportation planning in order to carry out the intent and purpose of programs under the Federal Consolidated Planning Grant for the fiscal year 2019, in order to further the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study's goals and objectives of maintaining a cooperative, continuous, and comprehensive framework for making transportation investment decisions in Akron metropolitan area; and declaring an emergency.

#### **PUBLIC SERVICE**

- 7 ORDINANCE determining to proceed with the improvement of Romig Road between the termini of I-76 and Vernon Odom Boulevard by paving; grading; constructing and reconstructing curbs, concrete sidewalks and driveway approaches; installing roof drain pipes and street lighting; and planting trees; and declaring an emergency.

#### **PUBLIC UTILITIES**

- 8 ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor or his designee to participate in the Water Resource Restoration Sponsor Program (WRRSP) and to enter into a Sponsorship Agreement with the entities listed in Exhibit A for the sponsorship of environmental restoration and preservation projects under the WRRSP; and declaring an emergency.
- 9 ORDINANCE authorizing the Purchasing Agent or her designee, without the formality of publicly advertising for bids, to enter into contracts to purchase various equipment, materials and labor in order to upgrade and replace the current supervisory control and data acquisition system ("SCADA") and related items at the Akron Water Plant located at 1570 Ravenna Road in Kent, Ohio; and declaring an emergency.
- 10 ORDINANCE authorizing the Purchasing Agent, or her designee, after publicly advertising for bids, to enter into a contract or contracts for the purchase of two (2) grit screws and troughs for replacement at the Water Reclamation Facility; and declaring an emergency.

## **PARKS & RECREATION**

- 11        ORDINANCE re-authorizing the My Neighborhood Our Akron City Council Grant Agreement Program, through which neighborhood-based organizations in each ward in the City are eligible for small grants in a total amount not to exceed Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) per ward; authorizing the Director of the Department of Neighborhood Assistance to enter into grant agreements with neighborhood-based organizations to carry out the purposes of the Program; and declaring an emergency.
