BUDGET & FINANCE

- 1 RESOLUTION amending Ordinance 93-2019, to replace the Neighborhood Partnership Program with the Beyond the Table grant award program; and declaring an emergency.

- 2 ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of the Department of Neighborhood Assistance or his designee to enter into contracts with non-profit neighborhood-based organizations for the provision of services and/or projects, including, among other things, neighborhood events, community gardens, beautification projects, after school programs, and mentoring programs; authorizing payment therefor; reallocating funding; and declaring an emergency.

PLANNING

- 3 ORDINANCE approving the 2019 Consolidated Action Plan including applications and certifications for the Community Development Block Grant, the HOME Investment Partnership, and Emergency Solutions Grant Programs; authorizing the Mayor, or his designee, to enter into related agreements for the operation and term of the Programs; and declaring an emergency. (Up for public hearing June 3, 2019 – Please see #1 on Regular Agenda)

- 4 ORDINANCE authorizing a Conditional Use to construct a parking area at 43 Pruitt Boulevard; and declaring an emergency. (Scheduled for Public Hearing on June 10, 2019)

- 5 ORDINANCE authorizing a Conditional Use to establish a child day care business center at 1335 W. Waterloo Road; and declaring an emergency. (Scheduled for Public Hearing on June 10, 2019)

- 6 ORDINANCE authorizing a Conditional Use to establish a child day care business center at 480 Lovers Lane; and declaring an emergency. (Scheduled for Public Hearing on June 10, 2019)

- 7 ORDINANCE authorizing a Conditional Use to establish a child day care business center at 474 Ardella Avenue; and declaring an emergency. (Scheduled for Public Hearing on June 17, 2019)

- 8 ORDINANCE authorizing a Conditional Use to establish U-Haul sales at 199 Massillon Road; and declaring an emergency. (Scheduled for Public Hearing on June 17, 2019)

- 9 ORDINANCE authorizing a Conditional Use to construct a monument sign at 1481 E. Market Street; and declaring an emergency. (Scheduled for Public Hearing on June 17, 2019)

- 10 ORDINANCE approving the historic designation of the Aster Avenue Business District as a historic district; and declaring an emergency.

- 11 ORDINANCE approving the sale of vacant City-owned land pursuant to the City's "A Lot for A Little" Program, in order to facilitate the productive re-use of the property and in furtherance of Mayor Horrigan's objectives of activating underutilized spaces for the benefit of the community, and reducing the cost to the City and the taxpayers in maintaining vacant lots; determining said property is not needed for public use; and declaring an emergency.

- 12 ORDINANCE approving the donation of certain City-owned land to the State of Ohio to facilitate the completion of the State Route 8 Bridge Project; determining said property is not needed for public use; and declaring an emergency.

- 13 ORDINANCE authorizing the purchase of 429 Wellington Ave. for the CSO Rack 10/11 Storage Basin Project; and declaring an emergency.

- 14 ORDINANCE accepting Various Right-of-Way Document(s) for certain properties to facilitate the completion of Frederick/Vernon Odom Blvd. Roadway Improvement Project; and declaring an emergency.

PUBLIC SERVICE

- 15 RESOLUTION declaring it necessary to improve certain streets in the City, between certain termini, by providing street-cleaning services and street lighting; and declaring an emergency.
- 16 RESOLUTION declaring it necessary to improve various off-street parking facilities in the Kenmore Business District and the Canton Road Business District by sealing, resurfacing and repairing, painting parking space stripes, sweeping, removing snow, cleaning sewer openings, providing lawn, turf, shrub and tree maintenance, litter and other general clean-up and otherwise improving and maintaining the same, and all when and where necessary; and declaring an emergency.
- 17 ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service or his designee, without publicly advertising for bids, to enter into a contract or contracts with Core & Main LP for the purchase of four tapping machines; and declaring an emergency.
- 18 ORDINANCE amending/supplementing Title 5, Chapter 50, “Sewers”, Section 50.81 “Discharge criteria for fats, oils and grease” of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Akron, by enhancing the Service Director’s authority to protect the City’s sewer system; and declaring an emergency.
- 19 ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into an agreement and/or legislation with the Ohio Director of Transportation for certain improvements on West Market Street; and declaring an emergency.
- 20 ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor to file an application and enter into an agreement with the Ohio Water Development Authority for a loan from the Water Supply Revolving Loan Account to provide funding for 11 projects of the Water Supply Bureau; and declaring an emergency.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- 21 RESOLUTION declaring that the City of Akron adopts and agrees to participate in the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan developed in conjunction with the County of Summit Emergency Management Agency; and declaring an emergency.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & JOB CREATION

- 22 ORDINANCE approving the addition of the property located at 21 North Hametown Road, in Bath Township to the Bath-Akron-Fairlawn Joint Economic Development District; authorizing the Mayor or his designee to amend the Bath-Akron-Fairlawn JEDD agreement to include the property located at 21 North Hametown Road; and declaring an emergency.
