BUDGET & FINANCE

- 1 ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Finance, or her designee, to pay \$15,000.00 for an operating subsidy to Cascade Locks Park Association, in order to support the maintenance of the Cascade Locks and Mustill Store Museum as a welcoming recreational and culturally educational urban green space; and declaring an emergency.

- 2 ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Finance, or her designee, to enter into a contract with the Akron/Summit Convention & Visitors Bureau, Inc. to pay an operating subsidy for the convention bureau in order to support the services and offerings of the convention bureau to the residents and visitors of the greater Akron area; authorizing payment therefor; and declaring an emergency.

- 3 ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance and sale of notes in a maximum principal amount of \$2,500,000, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to retire notes issued for the purpose of providing funds to pay expenses associated with the settlement of health care claims, whether by reserve or otherwise, and the City’s portion of the costs of maintaining its self-insurance program for employee health care benefits; and declaring an emergency.

- 4 ORDINANCE providing for the issuance and sale of bonds of the City in a maximum principal amount of \$12,060,000 for the purpose of refunding bonds issued by the City in 2010 to pay the costs of acquiring, constructing, improving, renovating, repairing, enlarging, adding to, reconstructing, maintaining, equipping, furnishing, acquiring interests in real property in connection with, improving the sites of, and otherwise improving, Community Learning Centers, and declaring an emergency.

- 5 ORDINANCE providing for the issuance and sale of notes in a principal amount not exceeding \$13,000,000 to pay the property owners' portion, in anticipation of the levy and collection of special assessments, of the cost of improving certain streets in the City, between certain termini, by providing street-cleaning services and street lighting; and declaring an emergency.
- 6 ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor or his designee, to enter into amendments (Supplement No. 3) to agreements between the City of Akron and Akron Energy Systems, LLC relating to the refunding of the \$13,200,000 Certificates of Participation, Series 2010 (Akron District Energy Project) previously issued to finance certain improvements to the City's steam, hot water and chilled water system; authorizing the execution of an amendment (Supplement No. 3) to a financing agreement; authorizing actions necessary and incidental thereto; and declaring an emergency.

PUBLIC SERVICE

- 7 ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service, or his designee, to enter into a contract or contracts after publicly advertising for bids, for the repair and/or replacement of three (3) expansion joints in the High Market Parking Deck; and declaring an emergency.
- 8 ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service or his designee, without the formality of publicly advertising for bids, to enter into a contract with the Otis Elevator Company for the emergency repair of elevators located in the Cascade Parking Deck; and declaring an emergency.
- 9 ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, after publicly advertising for bids, for the construction of the Opportunity Parkway Steam Condensate Project; approving specifications therefor; and declaring an emergency.

GREEN/SUSTAINABILITY

- 10 RESOLUTION opposing House Bill 242 (H.B. 242), the Ohio General Assembly's latest attempt to unreasonably interfere with local decision-making by prohibiting governments from regulating the local use of plastic products or placing any tax or fee on those products; and declaring an emergency.
