AKRON CITY COUNCIL ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS PASSED JULY 29, 2019

- 1 ORD 231-2019 authorizing the Mayor, or his designee, to enter to a grant agreement or agreements with United Disability Services; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0

- 2 ORD 232-2019 Authorizing the Director of Public Service, or his designee, to enter into an agreement or agreements with Triban Investment, LLC to construct roadway, water, and sewer improvements for the Crossings at Auld Farm development; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0

- 3 ORD 233-2019 authorizing the Mayor, or his designee, to apply for and, if awarded, accept and expend funding from the FY19 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) administered through the Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS) of the Ohio Department of Public Safety; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0

- 4 RES 234-2019 approving amendments to the Articles of Incorporation of the Akron-Summit County Energy Special Improvement District, Inc.; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0

- 5 ORD 235-2019 approving the Akron-Summit County Energy Special Improvement District Residential Program Plan; authorizing and approving the execution, delivery, and performance of a City Residential PACE Cooperative Agreement with respect to property assessed clean energy transactions in cooperation with the Akron-Summit County Energy Special Improvement District and the Toledo-Lucas County Port Authority; authorizing the Toledo-Lucas County Port Authority to approve petitions and plans for public improvements or public services submitted by the owners of real property within the City requesting that their property be added to the territory of the Akron-Summit County Energy Special Improvement District and assessed for the costs of such plans on behalf of the Council of the City; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0

- 6 ORD 236-2019 authorizing the Mayor, or his designee, without the formality of publicly advertising for bids, to enter into a contract or contracts with Submittable for access to the Submittable.com platform; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0

- 7 RES 237-2019 congratulating Diane Miller-Dawson on the occasion of her retirement and her many career achievements; thanking her for her dedicated service to the City of Akron; wishing her well in all of her future endeavors; and declaring an emergency. 13-0
- 8 ORD 238-2019 approving the agreements between the Fraternal Order of Police Akron Lodge #7, Local #1360/Ohio Council 8 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, and the Civil Service Personnel Association, Inc. bargaining units, and the City of Akron regarding adjustments in employee compensation; providing for these adjustments in compensation to apply to all employees in the non-bargaining, management, and unclassified job classes as well; all in furtherance of the Mayor's commitment to attract and retain qualified employees and provide appropriate wage increases commensurate with improved employee productivity and efficiency, and changes in the cost of living, while economically utilizing taxpayer dollars to provide vital, quality services to the citizens of the City of Akron; and declaring an emergency. VOTE: 11-1 (Milkovich) (Hoch abstained)
- 9 ORD 239-2019 amending and/or supplementing Ordinance No. 11-2011 and Ordinance No. 17-2016, approving the agreements between the Fraternal Order of Police Akron Lodge #7, Local #1360/Ohio Council 8 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, and the Civil Service Personnel Association, Inc. bargaining units, and the City of Akron regarding changes in health care benefits; providing for these changes to apply to the health care benefits for all eligible employees in the non-bargaining, management, and unclassified job classes, all in furtherance of the Mayor's commitment to attract and retain qualified employees and ensure a stable and productive workforce while implementing policies that will save taxpayer dollars, by providing competitive and fair health benefits for eligible employees; authorizing the Director of Finance to fund these benefits; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 10-1 (Milkovich) (Hoch, Neal abstained)
- 10 ORD 240-2019 authorizing a Conditional Use to expand Greenlawn Memorial Park Cemetery at 2696 Romig Road; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
- 11 ORD 241-2019 authorizing a Conditional Use to place an additional monument sign at 985 Gorge Boulevard; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 12-0 (*Swirsky did not vote*)
- 12 ORD 242-2019 authorizing a Conditional Use to vary the required side yard area to construct a detached garage at 832 Chester Avenue; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0

- 13 ORD 243-2019 authorizing a Conditional Use to construct a storage building at 560 E. Tallmadge Avenue; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 12-0 (*Hoch did not vote*)
- 14 RES 244-2019 denouncing President Donald Trump's inflammatory remarks aimed at Congresswomen Ocasio-Cortez, Omar, Pressley, and Tlaib; directing the clerk to forward a copy of this resolution; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 10-0 (Freemean, Kammer abstained) (*Hoch did not vote*)
- 15 ORD 245-2019 authorizing the Mayor or his designee to apply for and, if awarded, accept and expend grant funds associated with the Lead Hazard Reduction Grant Program (LHRGP) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; authorizing the expenditure of necessary local matching funds, if any; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
- 16 ORD 246-2019 determining to proceed with and levying special assessments for the improvement of certain streets in the City, between certain termini, by providing street-cleaning services and street lighting; approving the report of the Assessment Equalization Board; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
- 17 ORD 247-2019 determining to proceed with the improvement of Market Street between the termini of Westgate Circle and Portage Path, North Main Street between the termini of Olive Street and East Tallmadge Avenue and North High Street between the termini of Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard and East Market Street by resurfacing; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
- 18 ORD 248-2019 authorizing the Director of Public Service, or his designee, without the formality of publicly advertising for bids, to enter into a contract or contracts for construction of the Yellow Creek Bank Stabilization Project; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
- 19 ORD 249-2019 authorizing the Director of Public Service or his designee, after publicly advertising for bids, to enter into a contract or contracts for the modernization of the two Municipal Building elevators; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
- 20 ORD 250-2019 authorizing the Purchasing Agent, without the formality of publicly advertising for bids, to enter into a contract for the purchase of a FARO 360 Degree 3D Laser Scanner and related peripherals and warranties for use by the Akron Police Department; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0

- 21 RES 251-2019 approving and confirming the appointments of Rich Swirsky, John Malish, and Bob Keith to the Tree Commission; approving and confirming the appointment of Sarah Vradenburg to the Tree Commission with her term expiring on January 1, 2020; approving and confirming the appointment of Joyce Smith to the Tree Commission with her term expiring on January 1, 2021; and declaring an emergency.
