

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED OCTOBER 29, 2007

ORD. NO. 566-2007 approving the sale of city-owned land located at 724 Raymond Street to the Westside Neighborhood Development Corporation (WENDCO); determining said property is not needed for public use; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 567-2007 ratifying the actions of the Director of Public Service in contracting with Cavanaugh Building Corporation for emergency repairs to the duct work at the O'Neil's Parking Deck; authorizing payment therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 568-2007 authorizing the Director of Health to apply for a grant from the Ohio Department of Health to provide funding for local AIDS prevention programs; authorizing the Director of Health to enter into contracts to implement the grant from the Ohio Department of Health; authorizing payment therefore; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 569-2007 accepting a vacation plat for a part of 20-foot wide service court on the north side of East Waterloo Road, from South Firestone Boulevard West for approximately 425 feet; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 570-2007 authorizing the Director of Finance to implement a plan for the eligible employees in the Fire Division to purchase or re-purchase additional Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund ("OP&F") service credits on a tax-deferred basis by payroll deduction pursuant to IRS Code Section 414(h)(2) and Ohio Revised Code Chapter 742; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 571-2007 authorizing the Director of Finance to implement a plan for the eligible employees in the Police Division to purchase or re-purchase additional Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund ("OP&F") service credits on a tax-deferred basis by payroll deduction pursuant to IRS Code Section 414(h)(2) and Ohio Revised Code Chapter 742; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 572-2007 authorizing the Director of Finance to pay costs associated with the City's participation in miscellaneous organizations, associations and agencies, and declaring an emergency.
