

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED MARCH 1, 2010

RES. NO. 69-2010 declaring the necessity and intent of the City of Akron to appropriate a fee simple interest in real property owned by Albert N. Walker located at 696 Raymond Street, for the purposes of eliminating conditions of blight and preventing the recurrence of blight and furthering the objectives of the Edgewood Urban Renewal Plan; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 70-2010 authorizing a Conditional Use to permit the construction of the Buchtel/Perkins Community Learning Center at 1040 Copley Road; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 71-2010 amending The Zoning Map by changing the Commercial Use District (U4, H1, A3) Classification on property addressed as 19 North Union Street, 315 East Market Street, and 325-333 East Market Street to a Retail Business Use District (U3, H4, A3) Classification; and declaring an emergency. (02/22/10)

ORD. NO. 72-2010 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract with AA Blueprint for the purchase of a used Oce floor model large format multifunction graphics printer for use in the design office Utilities Engineering without the formality of advertising for bids; approving specifications therefore; repealing Ordinance No. 44-2010; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 73-2010 disapproving the report of the Assessment Equalization Board in connection with the improvement of Frank Boulevard between the termini of White Pond Drive and Ayers Avenue by paving, grading, constructing and reconstructing curbs, concrete sidewalks, driveway approaches, storm sewers and water mains, installing roof drain pipes, installing street lighting, and planting trees, appointing a new Assessment Equalization Board; and declaring an emergency.

ORD. NO. 74-2010 amending and supplementing Title 53 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Akron, Ohio by adding subsection 53.04 (C) to reduce paving special assessment rates on benefited residential property located on arterial streets with increased traffic due to traffic pattern revisions; and declaring an emergency.
