ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED FEBRUARY 10, 2014:

ORD. NO. 29-2014 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the reconstruction of existing sanitary sewer to increase flow capacity in the Mud Run sanitary sewer district; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 30-2014 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids through the office of the Purchasing Agent, for safety improvements at the Akron Water Plant; approving specifications therefor; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 31-2014 accepting the donation of property at Fox Road for Land Banking purposes; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 32-2014 accepting the donation of property at 1206 California Avenue for the C. D. Land Banking purposes; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 33-2014 authorizing the execution of a grant agreement with Repros, Inc.; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 34-2014 authorizing a Conditional Use to establish a used car lot at 1941 East Waterloo Road; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 35-2014 authorizing a Conditional Use to retain an accessory structure at 2437 Triplett Boulevard; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

RES. NO. 36-2014 adopting the 2014 Capital Investment and Community Development Program, also known as the Capital Investment Budget; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 37-2014 authorizing the issuance and sale of notes in a maximum principal amount of \$9,200,000, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to retire notes issued for the purpose of providing funds to pay expenses associated with the settlement of health care claims, whether by reserve or otherwise, and the City's portion of the costs of maintaining its self-insurance program for employee health care benefits; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 38-2014 authorizing the Mayor to file an application and enter into an agreement with the State of Ohio for funding for land acquisition adjacent to the Little Cuyahoga River through the Clean Ohio Conservation Fund; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

RES. NO. 39-2014 urging the United States Congress to raise the federal minimum wage to help working families and support economic growth; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 12-0 (Freeman did not vote)**
