ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED MAY 16, 2016:

ORD. NO. 154-2016 authorizing the Director of Finance to pay \$15,000.00 for an operating subsidy to Cascade Locks Park Association, in order to support the maintenance of the Cascade Locks and Mustill Store Museum as a welcoming recreational and culturally educational urban green space; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 155-2016 authorizing the issuance of a bond of the City in a principal amount not to exceed \$27,200,000 for sale to the Water Pollution Control Loan Fund of the State of Ohio to finance the costs of improvements to the City's wastewater system; pledging certain revenues from the City's wastewater system on a subordinated basis to secure the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bond; and authorizing the execution and delivery of the Bond, the Trust Agreement and other documents and the taking of other actions related to the issuance and sale of the Bond, and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 156-2016 authorizing the issuance of a bond of the City in a principal amount not to exceed \$18,200,000 for sale to the Water Pollution Control Loan Fund of the State of Ohio to finance the costs of improvements to the City's wastewater system; pledging certain revenues from the City's wastewater system on a subordinated basis to secure the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bond; and authorizing the execution and delivery of the Bond, the Trust Agreement and other documents and the taking of other actions related to the issuance and sale of the Bond, and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 157-2016 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the emergency replacement of a chiller unit for the HVAC system at the Balch Street Community Center; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 158-2016 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the purchase of brass water fittings to meet the ongoing installation and repair needs of the Water Supply Bureau; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 159-2016 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, after publicly advertising for bids, for the tools, labor and materials to rebuild one Influent Parkson headworks screen at the Water Reclamation Facility; approving specifications therefore; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 160-2016 authorizing a Conditional Use to install oversized signage at 1 Cascade Plaza in furtherance of Mayor Horrigan's objectives of promoting the visibility of Downtown businesses; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 13-0**

ORD. NO. 161-2016 authorizing a Conditional Use to construct a telecommunications tower at 27 Goodwin Avenue; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE: 10-3 (Keith, Kilby, Swirsky)**

RES. NO. 162-2016 opposing and objecting to the application of Alex Bar and Grill, Inc., 1655 S. Hawkins Road, Akron, Ohio 44320 for a Class D1, D2 liquor permit (21728420001) now pending before the Division of Liquor Control; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 13-0***

RES. NO. 163-2016 opposing and objecting to the application of Alex Bar and Grill, Inc., 1655 S. Hawkins Road, Akron, Ohio 44320 for a Class D3 liquor permit (21728420001) now pending before the Division of Liquor Control; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 13-0***

RES. NO. 164-2016 expressing strong opposition to House Bill 180, which, if signed by Governor John Kasich, would prohibit cities from requiring contractors to employ local residents on public improvement projects, even when those projects are funded primarily or entirely with local funds; denouncing this infringement on the City's Home Rule Authority and ability to ensure that the community shouldering the costs of these projects also enjoys the greatest possible economic benefit through local hiring, apprentice opportunities and minority contracting requirements; and urging City residents to contact Governor Kasich asking him to veto House Bill 180; and declaring an emergency. ***VOTE: 13-0***
