## ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS PASSED JULY 17, 2017:

**ORD 231-2017** authorizing the City to enter into a lease agreement/option contract with 346 Morgan Avenue, LLC for the lease and/or purchase of a parking lot; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE 11-0 (Hoch, Mosley Samples absent)**

**ORD 232-2017** authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement for funding through the 2017 Ohio Community-Police Relations Grant Program administered through the State of Ohio, Office of Criminal Justice Services; authorizing the expenditure of local funds in support of this grant; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE 11-0 (Hoch, Mosley Samples absent)**

**ORD 233-2017** authorizing the Director of the Department of Planning and Urban Development to enter into an agreement or agreements with local agencies to carry out the Emergency Solutions Grant Program for program year 2017 authorizing payment therefor; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE 9-0 (Freeman, Omobien abstained) (Hoch, Mosley Samples absent)**

**ORD 234-2017** approving the sale of vacant, City-owned property; determining said property not to be needed for a public use; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE 10-0 (Neal abstained) (Hoch, Mosley Samples absent)**

**ORD 235-2017** authorizing the Mayor to enter in an agreement for the lease and sale of city-owned property to Akron Soul Train; determining said property is not needed for public use; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE 11-0 (Hoch, Mosley Samples absent)**

**ORD 236-2017** authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement to sell approximately 1.4 acres of land to Ohio Pure Foods; determining that the property is not needed for a public use; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE 11-0 (Hoch, Mosley Samples absent)**

**ORD 237-2017** determining to proceed with the improvement of certain streets between certain termini in accordance with Resolution No. 151-2017 (2017 Phase I Arterial/Collector Resurfacing Program); and declaring an emergency. **VOTE 11-0 (Hoch, Mosley Samples absent)**

**ORD 238-2017** approving the report of the Assessment Equalization Board selected pursuant to Section 53.03 of the Code of Ordinances of the City and Resolution No. 149-2017 passed May 15, 2017 (the "Resolution of Necessity"), to hear and determine all objections to the special assessments for the improvement of certain streets between certain termini in accordance with the Resolution of Necessity (2017 Phase I Unimproved Street Resurfacing Program); determining to proceed with the improvement; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE 11-0 (Hoch, Mosley Samples absent)**

**ORD 239-2017** approving the report of the Assessment Equalization Board selected pursuant to Section 53.03 of the Code of Ordinances of the City and Resolution No. 150-2017 passed May 15, 2017 (the "Resolution of Necessity"), to hear and determine all objections to the special assessments for the improvement of certain streets between certain termini in accordance with the Resolution of Necessity (2017 Phase I Residential Resurfacing Program); determining to proceed with the improvement; and declaring an emergency. **VOTE 11-0 (Hoch, Mosley Samples absent)**
