### ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS PASSED JANUARY 28, 2019

- 1      ORD 27-2019 approving the sale of vacant City-owned properties pursuant to the City's "A Lot for A Little" Program; determining said property is not needed for public use; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
  
- 2      RES 28-2019 expressing support for the application to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources to designate the Cuyahoga River as a State Designated Water Trail; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
  
- 3      ORD 29-2019 authorizing the Director of Public Service or his designee to enter into a contract or contracts with Habitat for Humanity for the construction of sanitary sewer system improvements on or around East Avenue; authorizing payment therefor; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
  
- 4      ORD 30-2019 authorizing the Director of Neighborhood Assistance or his designee to enter into a contract or contracts with the Board of Education of the Akron Public School District for the Community Learning Centers' Akron After School Program in order to provide learning enrichment activities; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
  
- 5      ORD 31-2019 authorizing the Director of Public Service or his designee to enter into a contract or contracts, after publicly advertising for bids, for the replacement and/or upgrade of existing lighting fixtures at Canal Park Stadium; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
  
- 6      ORD 32-2019 authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract, without the formality of advertising for bids, with the Ohio Edison Company for the detailed engineering, material procurement, and construction services related to removal and relocation of Ohio Edison's Darrow-West Akron transmission facilities; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 13-0
  
- 7      RES 33-2019 urging the City of Akron to implement a temporary utility relief policy for qualifying individuals impacted by the recent shutdown of the federal government; and declaring an emergency. VOTE 12-1 (Freeman)
