

The Akron City Council enacted Ordinance No.173-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of Hampton Ridge Drive between the western terminus on Smith Road and the eastern terminus on Smith Road by paving; grading; constructing and reconstructing curbs and driveway approaches, all together with the necessary appurtenances. The assessments against each lot or parcel of land may be paid within 30 days after July 27, 2021. If not paid in cash within that time, the assessments will be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in twenty semi-annual payments, representing ten annual installments, with interest at the same rate as borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments. The assessments levied by the ordinances are now on file and may be inspected at the office of the City Assessor.

The Akron City Council enacted Ordinance No.174-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of Massillon Road between the termini of Triplett Boulevard and Penthley Avenue by paving; grading; constructing and reconstructing curbs, concrete sidewalks, driveway approaches, storm sewers, sanitary sewers and water mains; installing roof drain pipes; and planting trees, all together with the necessary appurtenances. The assessments against each lot or parcel of land may be paid within 30 days after July 27, 2021. If not paid in cash within that time, the assessments will be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in twenty semi-annual payments, representing ten annual installments, with interest at the same rate as borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments. The assessments levied by the ordinances are now on file and may be inspected at the office of the City Assessor.

The Akron City Council enacted Ordinance No.175-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of Forest Edge Drive, Aeries Way, Carriage Hill Lane, Fox Trace Trail, High Hampton Trail, Timberline Trail, Bent Creek Trail and Deer Ridge Run between certain termini by paving; grading and resurfacing, all together with the necessary appurtenances. The assessments against each lot or parcel of land may be paid within 30 days after July 27, 2021. If not paid in cash within that time, the assessments will be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in twenty semi-annual payments, representing ten annual installments, with interest at the same rate as borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments. The assessments levied by the ordinances are now on file and may be inspected at the office of the City Assessor.

The Akron City Council enacted Ordinance No.176-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of Market Street between the termini of Westgate Circle and Portage Path, North Main Street between the termini of Olive Street and East Tallmadge Avenue and North High Street between the termini of Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard and East Market Street by resurfacing. The assessments against each lot or parcel of land may be paid within 30 days after July 21, 2021. If not paid in cash within that time, the assessments will be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in 10 semi-annual payments, representing 5 annual installments, with interest at the same rate as borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments. The assessments levied by the ordinances are now on file and may be inspected at the office of the City Assessor.

The Akron City Council enacted Ordinance No.177-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of West Emerling Avenue between the termini of Firestone Parkway and South Main Street by paving; grading; constructing and reconstructing curbs, concrete sidewalks and driveway approaches; and installing roof drain pipes, all together with the necessary appurtenances. The assessments against each lot or parcel of land may be paid within 30 days after July 27, 2021. If not paid in cash within that time, the assessments will be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in twenty semi-annual payments, representing ten annual installments, with interest at the same rate as borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments. The assessments levied by the ordinances are now on file and may be inspected at the office of the City Assessor.

The Akron City Council enacted Ordinance No.178-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of Brittain Road between the termini of Tallmadge Avenue and Independence Avenue by constructing and reconstructing curbs and concrete sidewalks, all together with the necessary appurtenances. The assessments against each lot or parcel of land may be paid within 30 days after July 27, 2021. If not paid in cash within that time, the assessments will be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in twenty semi-annual payments, representing ten annual installments, with interest at the same rate as borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments. The assessments levied by the ordinances are now on file and may be inspected at the office of the City Assessor.

The Akron City Council enacted Ordinance No.179-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of Canton Road between the termini of Wedgewood Drive and the southern corporate limit and between the termini of East Market Street and State Route 76 by resurfacing. The assessments against each lot or parcel of land may be paid within 30 days after July 21, 2021. If not paid in cash within that time, the assessments will be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in 10 semi-annual payments, representing 5 annual installments, with interest at the same rate as borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments. The assessments levied by the ordinance are now on file and may be inspected at the Office of the City Assessor.

The Akron City Council enacted Ordinance No.180-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of State Route 91 between the termini of Interstate 76 and the northern corporate limit and between the termini of East Market Street and Wedgewood Drive by resurfacing. The assessments against each lot or parcel of land may be paid within 30 days after July 21, 2021. If not paid in cash within that time, the assessments will be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in 10 semi-annual payments, representing 5 annual installments, with interest at the same rate as borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments. The assessments levied by the ordinance are now on file and may be inspected at the Office of the City Assessor.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Akron, Ohio, enacted Ordinance No. 181-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of certain streets between certain termini set forth in Resolution No. 87-2020 (the "Resolution of Necessity") by

resurfacing such streets with asphaltic concrete 402/404; that the assessment against each lot or parcel of land may be paid in cash within 30 days from the date of passage as above mentioned, or if not paid in cash shall be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in ten semi-annual installments with interest thereon at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments. The assessments levied by such ordinance are now on file and may be inspected in the office of the City Assessor.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Akron, Ohio, enacted Ordinance No. 182-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of certain streets between certain termini set forth in Resolution No. 88-2020 (the "Resolution of Necessity") by resurfacing such streets with asphaltic concrete 402/404; that the assessment against each lot or parcel of land may be paid in cash within 30 days from the date of passage as above mentioned, or if not paid in cash shall be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in ten semi-annual installments with interest thereon at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments. The assessments levied by such ordinance are now on file and may be inspected in the office of the City Assessor.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Akron, Ohio, enacted Ordinance No. 183-2021 on July 19, 2021 levying special assessments for the improvement of certain streets between certain termini set forth in Resolution No. 89-2020 (the "Resolution of Necessity"), by treating the surface thereof with substances designed to preserve the surface; that the assessment against each lot or parcel of land may be paid in cash within 30 days from the date of passage as above mentioned, or if not paid in cash shall be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in ten semi-annual installments with interest thereon at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments. The assessments levied by such ordinance are now on file and may be inspected in the office of the City Assessor.

Summary of Ordinance # 184-2021 determining to proceed with and levying special assessments for the improvement of certain streets in the City, between certain termini, by providing street-cleaning services and street lighting; all together with necessary appurtenances. The assessments against each lot of parcel of land will be certified to the County Fiscal Officer for collection with other taxes in two semi-annual payments, representing one annual installment, with interest at the same rate as borne by the bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments. The assessments levied by the ordinance are now on file and may be inspected at the office of the City Assessor. The Ordinance was enacted as an emergency measure and went into effect upon its passage.
